BUILDING A NAME BLOCK

Your name here:

- 1. Using a ruler and pencil, sketch in a layout for your name block below. Consider how the letters will fit together some combinations of letters require careful planning in order to make everything work. 2 1/2" has been a good letter width to work with.
- 2. Determine the overall length that your name block will be and cut a piece of 2x4 lumber on the sliding miter saw.
- 3. Using measuring and layout tools, transfer your sketched letters onto the surface of the 2x4.
- 4. Starting with the bandsaw, cut away the parts of the letter that are not needed.
- 5. Use a drill press to drill a hole through any openings that do not touch the edge of your block
- 6. Use a coping saw if you wish to enlarge the drilled hole.
- 7. Use files, rasps, sandpaper and sanding machines to smooth the edges of your block.
- 8. Paint or decorate!

Files, Rasps (shaping)
